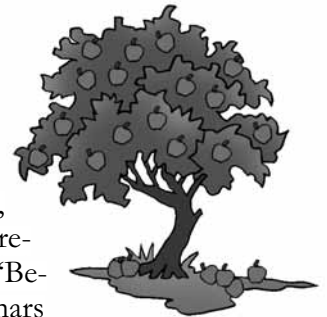

## “Believe In Tomorrow” Congregational Forums

During the month of October, Trinity will again be holding congregational forums with the theme, “Believe in Tomorrow.” These seminars will focus on two areas of Trinity’s life and mission:



1. A report and update of the top five concerns expressed during last year’s twelve congregational seminars. A detailed report on the findings was included in last year’s annual report. Since that time, the Congregation Council and leadership have been busy studying this report and working on how Trinity may act to address these concerns.
2. At the next annual meeting in January, we will be voting to approve a budget for Trinity. The Congregation Council and leadership wish to have input from the congregation on the development of the budget, so that there may be a greater understanding of financial needs and the need to support Trinity’s budget.

There will be opportunities to have your voice heard at congregational forums every Sunday in October:

- Sunday, October 9, 9:15 to 10:15 a.m., sanctuary
- Sunday, October 16, 9:15 to 10:15 a.m., sanctuary
- Sunday, October 23, 9:15 to 10:15 a.m., parlor
- Sunday, October 30, 9:15 to 10:15 a.m., parlor

One or more weekday evening forums, if there are enough members who wish such an arrangement.

Again, as we did last year, we will be phoning Trinity members to encourage attendance at one of these forums. We look forward to your participation!

## Trinity Mission Endowment and Memorial

Trinity's Mission Endowment and Memorial Action Team continues to develop opportunities for the members of Trinity to participate in growing our Mission Endowment Fund and our Memorial Fund. We are working specifically in two ways:

### 1. Mission Endowment

Every other month, we conduct a Charitable Giving Seminar. The purpose is to inform Trinity's members about financial planning. It is essential that each family unit (a single person, a young family or the empty nester) be aware of important financial/property planning for every stage of life. We are not trying to sell anything. We are simply seeking to assist our members to be good stewards of their possessions. We provide a detailed resource packet for you to use as you wish. The next seminar will be held on Sunday, November 20, 9:15 - 10:15 a.m., in the church parlor.

### 2. Memorial

We are asking members to remember to give a memorial "in memory of", "in honor of" or "in recognition of" someone. Memorial cards are available at the Welcome Desk Kiosk. There are six categories for which you may designate a memorial: Christian Education, Facility Needs, Worship, Trinity Youth Services, Outreach, or Trinity's Endowment Fund.

We are currently working with the Congregation Council's Ministry Teams to develop a priority listing of needs for each of the six Memorial Fund categories. Then, when there are enough funds available, the appropriate item(s) may be purchased. We will be publishing the list of priorities in the near future.

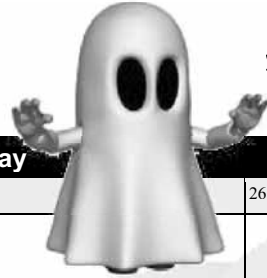

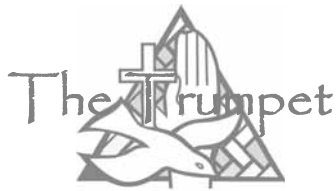
