This stewardship drive is very brief:

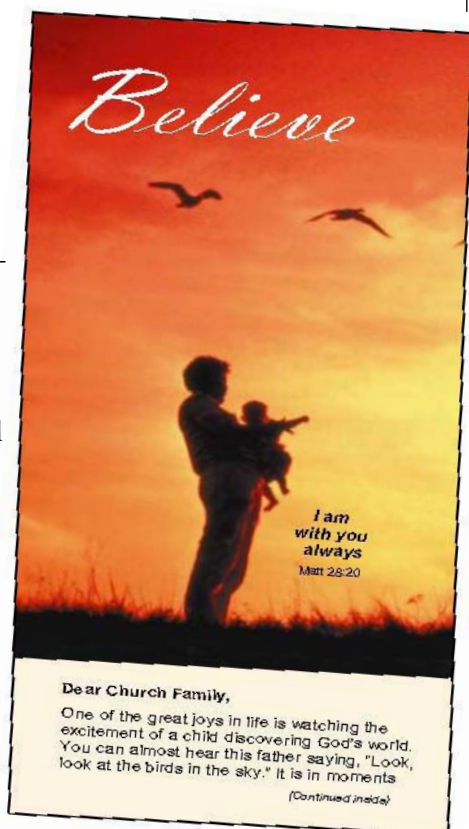

Hundreds of popular retailers participate in our SCRIP program including Jewel/Osco, Walmart, Dress Barn, Best Buy, Amazon.com and many, many others.

You're probably asking yourself how these stores help us raise money. It's simple—participating retailers agree to sell gift certificates/cards to our church at a discount; member families like yours buy the cards for full face value, they redeem them for full face value, and Trinity keeps the difference as revenue.

The beauty of SCRIP is that you put your regular household shopping dollars to work. You earn money for our church without spending a single additional penny. Just spend your regular shopping dollars with SCRIP at the stores that participate in the SCRIP program! SCRIP can be used for just about any household purchase including food, clothing, entertainment, gasoline, and even dining. Of course, don't forget your Christmas shopping! ☺

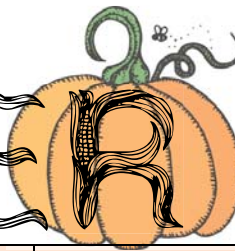

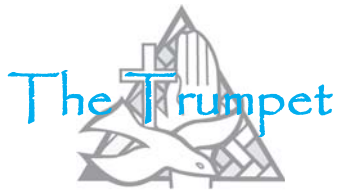
